Oscar Hammerstein last night withdrew Hammerstein's opera of "Thalia," in which he had previously announced Miss Lena Cavalleri would make her first appearance at the Manhattan Opera House a week from Saturday night. Mr. Hammerstein took his action after Miss Mary Garden wrote him resigning from the Manhattan Opera Company. Miss Garden wrote out her resignation yesterday morning after she had read Mr. Hammerstein's announcement that Miss Cavalleri was to appear in the Manhattan opera. This is Miss Garden's letter:

My Dear Mr. Hammerstein: On Monday afternoon, when you told me that you were to engage Miss Cavalleri to sing "Thalia," I said to you that the day this announcement was given to the newspapers in the Manhattan Opera House, I published an announcement, and accordingly I hereby send you my resignation. MARY GARDEN, Jan. 20, 1909.

As soon as Mr. Hammerstein received Miss Garden's letter he issued this statement: "I am in my contracts with my company to sing in my opera 'Thalia' on Monday afternoon, when you told me that you were to engage Miss Cavalleri to sing 'Thalia.' I said to you that the day this announcement was given to the newspapers in the Manhattan Opera House, I published an announcement, and accordingly I hereby send you my resignation. MARY GARDEN, Jan. 20, 1909.

Mr. Hammerstein then ordered the announcement that Miss Cavalleri was to appear in the opera to be stricken from the bill of next week. Whether or not this concession on Mr. Hammerstein's part will cause Miss Garden to withdraw her resignation is not known. It is said that she had left the city and would not return until to-day. Mr. Hammerstein, however, said that he thought all trouble would be averted and that Miss Garden would sing in the opera.

Mr. Hammerstein said that if she continued to sing, Miss Cavalleri would sing in the opera to-morrow night, and that both Miss Cavalleri and Miss Cavalleri were rehearsing the title role in "Salome" and would sing it if necessary.

PROHIBITION WINS AGAIN

Holiday Bill Passed Over Governor's Veto by Tennessee Legislature.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Jan. 20.—The Holiday State-wide prohibition bill was passed over Gov. Patterson's veto in both houses of the Legislature to-day.

C., Jan. 20.—At the request of a majority of the Legislature, which is favorable to prohibition, the legal advisers of the anti-saloon league have drafted a bill providing for a tax of \$1 a gallon on all liquor brought into the State and forbidding transportation companies from delivering at hotels any such tax is paid.

NEW TELEPHONE SYSTEM

Plans for an Independent Line from Boston to Omaha.

SPECIAL TO THE NEW YORK TIMES. BOSTON, Jan. 20.—An undertaking that it is stated will affect the entire country is to be brought to a head at the meeting of the Conference of Committees of the Independent Telephone Officers, which convenes next Saturday in New York.

This is the final adoption of the construction of an independent telephone system from Boston to Omaha and Lincoln, Neb., and it is estimated that it will involve an expenditure of \$5,000,000, and an investment of probably \$30,000,000 within the next four years.

At the head of the enterprise are Max Koehler, the foremost independent telephone man in the country, and H. C. Stifel, St. Louis, representing large independent interests in the Middle West. The financial end of the undertaking, it is said, has been provided for. It remains only to work out the construction and operating details.

The matter has been under discussion since last May, and an enormous amount of preliminary work has already been accomplished. All the principal independent companies of the country are directly interested in the enterprise, and their officers are working in co-operation with Messrs. Koehler and Stifel.

JENKINSES WIN AGAIN

Justice Scudder Grants Change of Venue in Bank Conspiracy Case.

Supreme Court Justice Scudder in Brooklyn yesterday granted Justice Frank Jenkens a change of venue from Kings County.

The Jenkineses were indicted on a charge involving the use of the funds of the Jenkens and Williams Trust Companies, asserting that they could not obtain a fair trial in Brooklyn, they obtained a change of venue from Justice Scudder. Recently John G. Jenkens, Jr., was tried on a charge of misappropriating \$50,000 of the funds of the Jenkens Trust Company. The jury acquitted Jenkens.

On the strength of this acquittal, which, he held, showed that there was no prejudice against the Jenkineses in Brooklyn, District Attorney Clarke asked Justice Scudder to reconsider his decision granting a change of venue. In denying the application Justice Scudder said that the suggestion that the District Attorney would lose control of the prosecution by the change of venue was more technical than real. The other indictments will be tried in Kings County.

JUPITER'S EIGHTH SATELLITE.

Report Says It Was Photographed at Greenwich Jan. 16.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Jan. 20.—A cablegram received at the Harvard College observatory from Kiel states that the eighth satellite of Jupiter was photographed at the Greenwich observatory on Jan. 16.

The position of the satellite was in right ascension, 10 hours 56 minutes 47.7 seconds, and declination, plus 7 degrees 40 minutes 48 seconds. Its daily motion was in right ascension minus 1 minute and in declination plus 1 minute. The satellite is visible in a large telescope.
